In the past 3 years the Office's Civil Division has recovered over \$385 million from 36 health care fraud investigations. On January 16, 2009, HHS published the final rule to adopt ICD-10-CM for all diagnosis coding and ICD-10-PCS for inpatient hospital procedure coding. The implementation date for ICD-10-CM and ICD-10-PCS is October 1, 2013. Although we are still several years away from implementation, it is not too early to begin the preparation, assessment, planning, and budgeting phases. The impact of this new coding system expands beyond the coding department; it will also impact billing, finance, information systems, compliance, and internal audit.
